

## Acts 2:14-40

We all are called by Jesus to be a witness of Him in our world.

(1) Peter was aware of the stirring around him.

(2) Peter responded and step forward, he didn't start the conversation but engaged the conversation.

(3) Peter told the story of Jesus through the Scriptures they already knew.

The Gospel is an announcement of an event that is good for all people - Jesus has been raised from the dead and is enthroned in heaven!

The Gospel is the good new that God our Father, the Creator, out of His great love for us, has come to rescue us from sin, satan, death and hell, and to renew all things, in and through the work of Jesus Christ on our behalf, to establish His kingdom, through His people who participate in loyal allegiance in the power of the Holy Spirit. This is for God's great glory, and our profound joy.

Peter's Summary: Jesus is both LORD and MESSIAH.

The proper response to hearing the story of Jesus as Lord and Messiah who has been resurrected and enthroned is three-fold:

1. Repent toward God
2. Baptism
3. Receive the Holy Spirit
