We are Radiant People.

Radiant means: "sending out light; shining or glowing brightly"

Radiant People shine the life of God.

2 Corinthians 3:3-18 (Fresh Start Bible, Pg 1023)

The Holy Spirit produces radiant life.

What is the glory of God?

Exodus 33:7-2 (Fresh Start Bible, Page 83)

Moses was an intercessor.

Jesus is our intercessor.

The Glory of God is the eminent expression of His goodness.

- 1. God's Goodness is seen in forgiveness.
- 2. God's forgiveness makes room for His favor.
- 3. God's favor is the Holy Spirit's presence.

God comes where He is wanted and worshiped.

Make Moses' prayer, your prayer: "..let me know your ways so I may understand you more fully and continue to enjoy your favor."

PRACTICING THE WAY

Start the Fresh Start Pathway with a friend.
